In fiscal year 2021, Arden Shore provided expert care and resources to 1,600 children and adults.

PROGRAMS

Waukegan Group Home

Arden Shore's group home is a safe and caring environment for youth whose needs extend beyond the traditional foster care setting, providing 24/7 therapeutic support the children need to grow into healthy adults. The programming provides youth with opportunities to develop the skills necessary to live on their own, build resiliency, and overcome the effect of early childhood trauma. Arden Shore's group home is designed to support youth's positive transition toward independence. Serving nine youth this year, five boys transitioned from the group home to more independent environments

Behavioral Health and Support Services

Therapeutic professionals work with adults, children and families to make sure they have the tools they need to heal from difficult situations like trauma, domestic violence, or substance abuse. Highly trained professionals provided individual and family therapy, substance abuse counseling, mental health assessments, and trauma-informed parenting groups to 350 individuals in 2021.

Arden Shore also continues to strengthen the Lake County Mental Health Workforce through its robust internship program, hosting 85 interns from 19 college and university programs since the launch of the program in 2018. "Working at Arden Shore has reaffirmed my passion for helping people, creating mental health awareness, and breaking down stigmatization in my community," shared one intern.

Intact Family Preservation

Intact Family Preservation Services keep families together. This year, Arden Shore's staff partnered with over 950 family members, with over 60% of families successfully completing their goals. Staff work with families who may be at risk of disruption or separation, providing parenting skills education, family advocacy, and support in the family's home. Families choose to participate in these services voluntarily, with the goal to stay healthy, together, and thrive at school, at work, and other areas of their life.

Arden Shore works closely with foster families to provide a nurturing home and stable environment while providing parents with resources, skills, and opportunity necessary for reunification. This year, Arden Shore's professional staff served 495 children and families and remain passionate about making sure children are in homes that provide the necessary stability and love we all need to reach our full potential.
