# **PROGRAMS**

Arden Shore Child and Family Services envisions a future free of abuse and neglect, and full of opportunity--where our community is a healthy place to live, work, and play. Formed in 1898 Arden Shore began as a summer respite camp for mothers and children. Over the years, the facility and location have changed, but the driving force has always been to build the well-being of children and families so that everyone can reach their full potential. The root causes of childhood trauma and maltreatment are complex. That is why Arden Shore worked hard to secure multiple certifications in mental health, substance abuse, and foster care and maintains strong collaborative relationships with other community service organizations — working to provide the resources families need to stay healthy and together, ensuring home is a place where everyone can thrive. In 2022, Arden Shore provided expert care and resources to 1,850 children and adults.


# Behavioral Health and Support Services

Therapeutic professionals work with adults, children and families to make sure they have the tools they need to heal from difficult situations like trauma, domestic violence, or substance abuse. Highly trained professionals provided individual and family therapy, substance abuse counseling, mental health assessments, and trauma-informed parenting groups to 286 individuals last year.

There are only 14 behavioral health care providers for every 10,000 Illinois residents. By 2030 Illinois is predicted to have a shortage of more than 3,300 providers (Source: Kaiser Family Foundation, American Psychological Association, NAMI Ilinois). That's why Arden Shore's service program is also a robust teaching program, collaborating with 19 master-level schools and preparing counseling and social work students to meet the needs of the community.

# Waukegan Group Home

The Waukegan Group Home offered a safe and caring environment for youth whose needs extended beyond the traditional foster care setting, with 24/7 therapeutic support and opportunities to develop the skills necessary to live on their own, build resiliency, and overcome the effect of early childhood trauma. 100% of children who completed their treatment were able to move either to a foster home, home of relative, or more independent setting. 2022 marked Arden Shore's last year operating its residential group home for youth in Waukegan, refocusing organizational resources on Arden Shore's Foster Care, Intact, and Behavioral Health programs.

## Intact Family Preservation Services

Intact Family Preservation Services keep families together. Staff work with families who may be at risk of disruption or separation, providing parenting skills education, family advocacy, and support in the family's home. Families choose to participate in these services voluntarily, with the goal to stay healthy, together, and thrive at school, at work, and other areas of their life. The Intact program impacted the lives of 844 individuals this year.



### Relative and Kin Connections Keep Families Strong


